The **Grateful Garment Project** (www.gratefulgarment.org) is a non-profit organization dedicated to providing new clothes, food, grooming items, and other necessary items to victims of sexual assault. Its mission is to ensure that every victim of a sexual crime who crosses the threshold of a Sexual Assault Response Team (SART) facility or who seeks medical attention and/or law enforcement involvement goes home with proper clothing and is provided with items they require to reduce further trauma. New member Lisa Blanchard, founder and Executive Director of the Grateful Garment Project, will explain the program and tell us how we can help.

Public Policy Committee – Spring Into Action

The California 2014 legislative process is underway and AAUW CA Public Policy Committee has swung into action. With input from Legislative Advocate Shannon Smith-Crowley and AAUW CA Public Policy Director Sue Miller, legislation that we will support or oppose has been reviewed and selected for advocacy. Selection of bills to consider and support are based on member approved priorities for action according to the criteria of viability, critical need and strong member support (information gathered on biennial all-member survey).

The highest priorities according to our members for 2011-2013 are: pay equity and fairness in compensation; adequate and equitable funding for quality public education for all students, and choice in the determination of one's reproductive life. It is early in the process. Many bills will be amended and go through multiple committee hearings before they get approved and sent to the Governor for passage into law. The Branch Public Policy Committee is committed to informing our members about bills of interest and how they can become advocates for AAUW's mission through the California legislation. What Does the Financially Fit For Life Committee Do?

The San Jose Branch formed a committee called Financially Fit For Life (FFFL) to educate women and girls in money management. FFFL was based on the AAUW-CA program called Money Trek developed in 2011-2012 that focused on basic financial literacy. The committee developed a shorter program that was given to the Girls Advisory Team under the auspices of the Office of Women's Policy in Santa Clara County.

Last Spring the FFFL committee presented a workshop on finances to the teenage girls at the *Strong Girls, Strong Women* conference. This program was called "Money Matters" and focused on the variety of cards that are used today including credit cards, gift cards, payroll cards, and debit cards. It was well received and will be presented again at this year's conference.

Each year our committee has also offered programs to our members, including guest speakers on Investments, Insurance, Tax Advantage giving, Elder Financial Protection, Personal Theft, and Charity giving. We hosted a Third Wednesday program for our members in March on \$pending Money Wisely on Travel. In April, we presented "Money Matters and Paying for College Loans" at a Brown Bag Lunch time at Evergreen Valley College.

"The World On Stage" was held on Saturday, February 15 at the Le Petit Trianon Theatre in San Jose to benefit AAUW's Legal Advocacy Fund (LAF). Including the audience, performers, members and volunteers, well over 200 people attended raising \$6,771 for LAF. LAF combats sex discrimination in higher education and the workplace by supporting legal cases that have the potential to make a difference to all women.

A post-event evaluation was conducted using an emailed questionnaire. There was unanimous support for similar events in the future indicating that events such as "The World On Stage" may be viable as a fundraising vehicle going forward.
