Public Policy

Advocating for Policies that Advance Equity for Women and Girls in California

California legislators are currently studying and voting on bills that advance AAUW's mission in our state. A few of the approximately 30 bills that AAUW CA has selected for support positions were highlighted at the recent AAUW-CA Convention:

*AB 2350 – Bonila, S. – Post-secondary education: Equity in Higher Education Act: Prevention of Pregnancy Discrimination.

Subject: Author Susan Bonila states: "AB 2350 seeks to increase the number of women in STEM fields by raising awareness that pregnancy discrimination is included in the federal Title IX standards."

*SB 477 – Steinberg, D. - Foreign Labor Contractor: Registration

Subject: Improving regulation of foreign labor contractors to prevent illegal trafficking of foreign workers.

*SB 899 - Mitchell, H. - CalWORKS: Eligibility (14 other legislators have "signed on" to the bill.) Subject: Amends regulations used to determine a family's maximum aid payment.

Regional and National Summits on Working Families AAUW is Invited

On June 23, President Barack Obama will convene the White House Summit on Working Families in Washington, D.C. to focus on modernizing workplace policies for America's future economic success. AAUW will be in attendance, calling for long-overdue updates to our nation's workplace policies.

As economic opportunities for women have increased, not all of our laws have kept up — wage discrimination persists, and most employees still lack care-giving or sick leave. As Obama noted in his 2014 State of the Union address, our policies are stuck in the *Mad Men* era. The summit will concentrate the national conversation on equal pay, workplace discrimination, paid leave, paid sick days, and care-giving challenges. STEM Experts Are Role Models for Tech Excellence Girls

What do the resource persons for Tech Excellence have in common? Expertise, long-standing careers, and a willingness to help middle school girls see how STEM improves our quality of life.

For Captain **Andrea Connell**, a 25-year United Airlines pilot, 2014 marked her 11th year of teaching the "Four Forces of Flight" (lift, thrust, drag, gravity) class to our seventh grade girls.

Dr. **Marilyn Pachorek**, a veterinarian at Los Gatos Dog and Cat Hospital, has been teaching for over 15 years, bringing other vets, a nurse, and dogs to the class adding zest to the program. Our girls learn how to don scrubs, perform physical exams on dogs, hear about animal diseases, identify animals' bones, and read xrays.

Dr. **June McCullough**, SJSU Professor of Communicative Disorders and Past President of the California Academy of Audiology, has completed her second year of teaching our girls. Eight graduate students assisted her in giving free hearing tests and facilitating the stations.

Dr. **Lee Hornberger**, a retired mechanical engineer, taught at Santa Clara University and worked at Apple and other large corporations. For two years in a row, she volunteered to teach the class on "Chemistry Engineering: Polymer/GAK."

Many thanks to our resource speakers and our volunteers/facilitators – Terri Anderson, Elaine Benoit, Sharon Burkett, Jane Guinther, Linda Guyer, Nancy Hooton, Jennifer Jackson, Kathy Mangan, Cheryl Markman, Sharon Niedermaier (community volunteer), and Edna Robison. Thank you also to all those who donated money to Tech Excellence! Special thanks go to the John Muir Middle School administration, especially their school secretary Dawn Heinzmann and the San Jose Unified School District for allowing the classes to be held onsite and arranging the field trips.
