In what is probably the busiest Board meeting of the year, Board members passed motions to:

- Move all Branch accounts to Chase Bank in Willow Glen.
- Support the biennial Public Policy Program of AAUW and AAUW CA.
- Accept for consideration a draft of the General Fund budget. The draft is available to all Branch members. Contact <u>Pat Diamond</u> if you would like her to send you a copy.
- 4. Arrange installation of new carpeting at Headquarters.
- Send the solicitation letter for AAUW Funds and LAF in February instead of October.
- 6. Approve the appointment of Bernice Redfern as Secretary to replace Elaine McMahon, who resigned.

Get Out The Vote Campaign The best way you can honor the brave suffragists who helped secure the passage of the 19th Amendment is to VOTE and ACT. AAUW members have a proud record of voting, even in mid-term elections (November 4). The "action" is to motivate young women to vote as well. Access to online registration and election information is important to younger (and older) voters. Spread the word that AAUW is recommending the nonpartisan website <u>canlvote.org</u>, where voters will find state by state information. The Branch Public Policy Committee will bring this information to students at the C/U campuses, along with voter education on issues. We are also partnering with the LWV SJ/SC for a Pros and Cons Forum on October 11 at the Bascom Avenue Library Community Room (see front page). AAUW-CA ballot initiative positions are displayed on the bulletin board and at <u>aauw-ca.org</u>.

California Tracked Bills AAUW-CA has had a successful legislative session so far. In 2014, we expect successful outcomes with supported bills to enforce Title IX for high school athletics, extend Title IX protections to pregnant and parenting graduate students, provide sexual harassment protections for unpaid interns, better protect students from sexual harassment and cyberbullying and remove barriers to full contraceptive coverage under the Affordable Care Act. The bills are on the Governor's desk; he must sign or veto by September 30. The Branch Public Policy bulletin board will display the Governor's Report Card when we have the final results.

AAUW San Jose has been providing scholarships for women for 34 years through the Local Scholarship Community Action Project. In addition to monetary donations from AAUW San Jose members, Local Scholarship is funded through grant writing and an annual Holiday Boutique, now in its 13th year. The Boutique will be held this year on Saturday, November 15. Donations of items for the Boutique are currently being sought. Please consider giving home-baked goods; handcrafted jewelry; needlework, hand-knitted or craft items; small gifts; holiday decorations and other items of décor. Many Interest Groups donate a thematic basket related to their area of interest. Thanks to your generosity, now in giving and with your purchases at the Boutique. Local Scholarships are available to women who have completed two full years at an accredited college or university and are enrolled in a four-year institution.
