"Investing In Girls -Women Leading The Way"

Throughout my teaching career I was concerned about fairness and equitable treatment of our children, particularly our girls. I am still concerned, believing that too many girls in our community and around the world are in crisis. Several of our Branch programs (Tech Trek, Tech Excellence, Scholarship, Gifts For Teens and Money Trek) offer wonderful opportunities for a few. But poverty, crime, homelessness, cuts in health care and education have devastating effects on growth, development and opportunities for girls. This year I want us to "invest in girls" by focusing on their health and education needs. We will use AAUW studies like "Crossing the Line", the highlyregarded study of sexual harassment in the schools and the 2012 "The State of Women and Girls" report which has revealed challenges for girls and women in Santa Clara County. Through Branch programs I hope to give our members the opportunity to learn, to study the issues, and to work on solutions.

"AAUW is making an unprecedented investment in making women's voices heard in the 2012 election", said AAUW's President Carolyn Garfen in a recent Public Policy communication. The objective of the "It's My Vote: I Will Be Heard" voter education and turnout campaign nationwide is to make sure women know what's at stake and where candidates stand on issues critical to women and girls. San Jose Branch members can participate by:

- Volunteering to staff voter registration tables at farmers' markets, fitness clubs and local colleges.
- Supporting California 2012 legislation that impacts the AAUW mission by reading bill summaries and signing letters of support (see instructions at Public Policy bulletin board at Headquarters.)
- Attending Pros & Cons Ballot Forum sponsored by Interbranch Council on September 29 at the Camden Community Center.
- Be informed: check the bulletin board at Headquarters for updates on AAUW issues at state and federal levels, including the top five benefits to women in the Affordable Care Act. Issue papers are available by contacting San Jose Branch Public Policy Committee Chair (see above) or at <u>www.aauw.org</u>. Use this information to inform others.
- Contact (postcards available at Fall Event) three young women and urge them to vote this fall.

The effort to broaden recognition of AAUW CA as an informed and trusted advocate for women's issues among state legislators and elected officials is succeeding. AAUW CA advocate Shannon Smith-Crowley reported that there are now over 10,000 persons signed up for the AAUW CA Action Alert (sign up for AAUW CA Action Alert at http://www.aauw-ca.org/ (click Public Policy)



As of August 1, 2012, all new health plans must cover eight women's preventive services, including birth control, without cost sharing. Preventive services are critical to a woman's health, and cost has remained a burden for far too long. With the Department of Health and Human Services regulations going into effect on August 1, the following services will now be available without co-pays:

- 1. Breastfeeding support, supplies, and counseling
- 2. Screening and counseling for interpersonal and domestic violence
- 3. Screening for gestational diabetes
- 4. DNA testing for high-risk strains of HPV
- 5. Counseling regarding sexually transmitted infections, including HIV
- 6. Screening for HIV
- 7. Contraceptive methods and counseling
- 8. Well woman visits.

We are proud to announce that our efforts to have the text of Title IX and Title IX Coordinator contact information included in high school student handbooks has been successful in several local districts. Flyers which highlight the benefits for girls participating in sports will be distributed to hundreds of incoming freshmen this fall. Posters encouraging girls to exercise their rights under Title IX will be posted at numerous schools. Copies of the AAUW report Crossing the Line have been given to Title IX coordinators and offers to present the results of this study on sexual harassment in our nation's schools (grades 7-12) have been accepted. It has been inspiring to meet with the Coordinators. We look forward to working with them and helping them to connect with each other during the coming year.
