## Directory of Title IX Coordinators 2016-2017

The updated Directory of Title IX Coordinators for Santa Clara County was distributed to all local school districts last month. The Title IX Coordinators' responsibilities are critical to the development, implementation, and monitoring of meaningful efforts to comply with Title IX. The Directory is intended to facilitate communication between Title IX Coordinators for the exchange of ideas, experiences and best practices. It is available as a resource to the community on the <a href="#">AAUW website</a> (search for Title IX). If friends or family have concerns about equity at school, the Directory will tell them who to contact.

This is the fifth Directory compiled by AAUW San Jose. Chair Laura Manthey was recognized by AAUW National as a Title IX Champion for starting the project. Many thanks to the members who helped with emails and phone calls to verify current contact information.

### Building and Properties Committee Income & Expense Report - November

The Building Fund Income and Expense Detail July 1 through October 2016 was entered and reviewed by the Building and Properties Committee on October 24. The rental income from our tenant Total Building Care, Inc. for \$1,498.00 was received for the month. The Expenses for the month include the payment of Real Estate Taxes (\$1,176.16) and Insurance (\$1,876.00) as budgeted. Our contract with Comcast was renewed for \$89.00/month for 3 years. This is \$12 less/month than our previous contract. Our new gardening service began this month. The new fee is \$150/month, which is \$25/month less than previous service.

Repair and painting of the front porch step and side railing along with touch-up painting of back porch and replacement of mid-section of the handrail of the tenant's stairwell were completed October 10. Total exterior building repair and maintenance was \$1,455.


