Branch Member Receives Honor from Board of Supervisors

Member Marlene Bjornsrud received a commendation from the Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors on May 8 for a "lifetime of work in the women's sports community to encourage the participation of women and girls in physical and sports activities." Several AAUW members and the "BAWSI Posse" attended the meeting to cheer for her. Marlene is one of the founders of the Bay Area Women's Sports Initiative (BAWSI), a long-time AAUW member and advocate for Title IX and, most recently, chair of the Public Policy Committee. BAWSI provides after-school sports programs for third to fifth grade girls in underserved schools and for children with disabilities.

Marlene spoke of her commitment to work with "children who would otherwise be overlooked by the sports community," thus missing out on the life-lessons that come with participation in sports activities. Marlene has just moved to Colorado, but says she will always be part of Santa Clara County. We envy the enthusiasm and commitment she will surely bring to her new home, and accept the challenge to keep that spirit alive through AAUW San Jose as well.

The 2016-2017 Board approved or reported the following:

- Resignation of Jane Guinther (moved to the East Coast) and appointment of Michelle Lalljie as the new Tech Trek Chair.
- Resignation of Marlene Bjornsrud (moved to Colorado) and appointment of Peg Carlson-Bowen as Public Policy Chair
- Building and Properties: Exterior work may need to be done with regard to gutters, downspouts, and dry rot. The plan partially references the Home Inspection Report from September 2014 and the information obtained from two (2) contractors and two (2) AAUW realtors.
- AAUW Fund/LAF Fundraising (Wine Tasting), June 25: Please read article on the front cover.
- Public Policy: Ramping up action items and membership, now up to 54. The Committee met on May 17 to plan for 2017-2018 advocacy and activism on Gender and Pay Equity, Title IX: Campus Sexual Violence, and Healthcare Access and Affordability.
- College and University Relations: Collaborated with Public Policy on a "Take Back the Night" event at San Jose State University to present AAUW information pamphlets on sexual violence.

- Membership Update: 322 members at the end of April versus 315 last year (reduction from March due to the passing of Carol Baker and Darlene Paulsen). The Open House on May 2 yielded seven (7) more members and eight (8) prospects.
