Guidelines for Opening Headquarters

AAUW is now open for meetings and events based on the following guidelines:

Meetings must be coordinated through the Calendar in Charge (calendar@aauwsanjose.org).

Organizers of the meeting must request a Certification of Vaccine Status from each attendee (forms are available in the Kitchen). After obtaining the form, the organizer should keep a list of those who signed a form. A form is required only once and are kept confidential. The organizer need only ensure that the form has been filled out, and the completed form should be put in the B&P Chair's folder in the Sunroom. Please note that the form does not require that the person have a vaccination; also, the person may choose not to disclose their vaccination status on the form. In such cases, the person must wear a mask.

Fully vaccinated individuals do not need to wear a mask while at AAUW (indoors or outdoors) unless they desire to continue wearing one.

Individuals who are not fully vaccinated or have chosen not to disclose vaccination status, must wear a mask indoors at all times, unless alone in a private office with the door closed, and outdoors when it is not possible to maintain six feet of physical distance from others.

To support good ventilation, open windows whenever possible.

There is a hand sanitizer dispenser in the mudroom and hand sanitizer is available in the bathroom as well. Please feel free to use these to ensure your safety.

If you wish to mask up and have forgotten your mask, masks are available in the front entryway on the postcard cart.

If you or a member of your group have symptoms or tested positive for COVID, please do not enter the building. Please report such instances if you have been associating with AAUW members so we can file the necessary reporting.
