Tech Trek Campers on Their Way

Members of the Tech Trek Committee finalized the 2023 Tech Trek STEM Camp selection process in March. The schools that participated are University Preparatory Academy, Muwekma Ohlone Middle School, Renaissance Academy at Fischer, and Renaissance Academy at Mathson. Our selection process involved evaluating the information on the student's application, their essay on the topic "How would you use math and/ or science to make the world a better place?" and an in-person interview.

As always, the difficult part was deciding which girls to send to camp; we were all impressed with the girls, their interest in STEM and their poise during the interview. After much discussion, we chose six girls to send to an in-person camp at Sonoma State University, and two to attend virtual Tech Trek. At least one girl from each school was selected to attend Tech Trek at Sonoma State University. The girls who have been selected and their parents are now busy completing all of the forms for the camp.

Inter Branch Council (IBC) will sponsor an Ice Cream Social at our Branch Headquarters on Sunday, June 4 for the campers and their parents. This will be an informative meeting for them to talk about what Tech Trek camp is like, what to bring (and what not to bring) to camp, and to answer any questions about Tech Trek that they have.

Public Policy Update

In April, Public Policy members wrote a letter of support and provided testimony to the Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors for the CEDAW (Convention on the Elimination of all forms of Discrimination Against Women) ordinance — which was approved. We also wrote nine letters of support to the California legislature on behalf of bills supported by AAUW CA. These include:
